## A CALL FOR THE IPBES YOUNG FELLOWS PILOT PROGRAMME

**Deadline is 31 May 2015**

---



The call for nominations of fellows for the IPBES young fellows pilot programme, follows up on the outcome of the third session of the Plenary (Decision IPBES/3/1).

**The pilot programme is targeting** young scholars who wish to gain experience by participating in the development of the regional and sub-regional assessments (Africa, Americas, Asia-Pacific and Europe and Central Asia) or the thematic assessment on land degradation and restoration.

**Selected fellows will take part as contributing authors to the chapter of the assessment they are selected for.** Fellows will attend two author meetings and receive training to gain an in-depth understanding of the IPBES assessment processes. Fellows from developing countries and countries with economies in transition will receive support to attend these two meetings, in accordance with UN rules.

Contributing authors to the assessments are, in accordance with the IPBES procedures, selected by the coordinating lead authors and lead authors to assist with the work (IPBES/2/17). The coordinating lead authors will hence also be responsible for selecting fellows for the IPBES young fellows pilot programme in consultation with the co-chairs and the management team of the assessment in question. Fellows can be selected from within the pool of nominated fellows as well as from the pool of experts already nominated for contributions to the assessments in question.

**Member States and Observers are invited to disseminate this call to relevant institutions and organisations** for their direct nomination of candidates to this programme. Nominations from a broad range of organization/institutions are encouraged. Self-nominations will not be accepted. Nominators are expected to give their consent to the time commitment required from the candidate.

**The IPBES young fellows pilot programme can offer fellowships for the following assessments:**

1) A **set of regional and sub-regional assessments of biodiversity and ecosystem services** (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex III), implementing work programme deliverable 2b, including for:

- a. A regional and subregional assessment for the Americas region (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex V), involving up to six fellows, with a first authors meeting scheduled for 20 - 24 July 2015;
- b. A regional and subregional assessment for the Africa region (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex IV), involving up to six fellows, with a first authors meeting scheduled 3 -7 August 2015;
- c. A regional and subregional assessment for the Asia and Pacific region (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex VI), involving up to six fellows, with a first authors meeting scheduled 17 -21 August 2015;
- d. A regional and subregional assessment for Europe and Central Asia (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex VII), involving up to six fellows, with a first authors meeting scheduled 31 August – 4 September 2015.

2) A **thematic assessment of land degradation and restoration**, implementing work programme deliverable 3bi (Decision IPBES/3/1 Annex VIII), involving up to eight fellows, with a first authors meeting scheduled 6 -10 July 2015 (tentative).

For an effective implementation of all of these deliverables, it is critical to include a broad variety of fellows from various natural and social scientific disciplines and from different knowledge systems, including indigenous and local knowledge systems, as well as policy and technical experts and practitioners. Organisations and institutions nominating experts are therefore encouraged to promote this multidisciplinary approach, which is fundamental to the success of IPBES.

### *Nomination procedure*

Organisations and institutions are invited to nominate fellows to participate in the IPBES young fellows pilot programme.

### The nomination process will follow these steps:

1. Nominees will be invited to fill out an **application form** and attach their curricula vitae through the dedicated web portal (<http://www.ipbes.net/fellowshipform.html>)
2. The **application form** will automatically be sent to the candidate's organisation/institution (the nominator) indicated by the nominee with an email providing a link to a **nomination and consent form**. The nomination and consent form invites the nominators to approve and submit their nominations as well as approve the time commitment required from the candidate.
3. The nominator and nominee will receive an acknowledgement message once the **nomination and consent form** confirming the nomination is submitted.

Interested candidates (nominees) are requested to fill out their application form **no later than 31 May 2015**. Nominators (organisations/institutions) should submit nominations by **5 June 2015 at the latest**. Earlier nominations are strongly encouraged.

**All candidates (nominees) should ensure that they:**

- Are available on the indicated dates to participate in the relevant meetings
- Have discussed the nomination and nomination procedure with their organisation/institution before applying

**Post-Doctoral Fellow, Mellon Program in Urban Landscape Studies**

**Position Title:** Post-Doctoral Fellow, Mellon Program in Urban Landscape Studies

**Department:** Garden and Landscape Studies

**Summary**

Garden and Landscape Studies at Dumbarton Oaks has received a major award from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation to create a new interdisciplinary Program in Urban Landscape Studies. This grant is one of 15 made by the Mellon Foundation so far to major institutions of higher education and research, aimed at fostering the joint contributions that the humanities and the design and planning disciplines may make to understanding the processes and effects of burgeoning urbanization. In conjunction with this award, Dumbarton Oaks will appoint a Post-Doctoral Fellow to participate in developing and coordinating the activities of the Mellon Program in Urban Landscape Studies within the Garden and Landscape Studies Program. The Fellow will report directly to the Director of Dumbarton Oaks and will work closely with the Director of Garden and Landscape Studies.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

Working in collaboration with the Director of Garden and Landscape Studies, the post-doctoral fellow will help develop the intellectual agenda and coordinate the activities of the Mellon Program in Urban Landscape Studies, which will bring scholars and designers together at Dumbarton Oaks to explore the history and future of urban landscapes ([www.doaks.org/research/garden-landscape/mellon-initiative-in-urban-landscape-studies/overview](http://www.doaks.org/research/garden-landscape/mellon-initiative-in-urban-landscape-studies/overview)). Primary duties will include assisting with planning, coordinating, and overseeing a series of academic and public events such as symposia, colloquia, lectures and other scholarly meetings; helping to coordinate the Mellon Fellowship program and mentoring Mellon fellows; coordinating a program of practitioner residencies; contributing to writing, editing, and coordinating urban landscape publications, both print and on line (including on line exhibitions); and coordinating programs with neighboring institutions and related urban studies initiatives. The appointee is expected to demonstrate excellent knowledge of both urban history and contemporary design practice; to facilitate intellectual exchange between scholars and practitioners; and to provide scholarly input into the program's academic and public events.

## **Qualifications**

### **Education and/or Experience**

- Ph.D. in urban, landscape, or design history; art or architectural history; history, anthropology, geography, or related fields, with a specialization in landscape or environmental studies.
- Familiarity with urban history, landscape architecture, and contemporary design required.
- Experience in scholarly publishing and teaching is desired.
- Superb organizational abilities, keen attention to detail, and ability to meet deadlines are essential.

### **Language skills**

English proficiency required; proficiency in additional languages desired. Excellent written and oral communication skills.

### **Computer skills**

Computer fluency is essential, particularly with Microsoft Office and Adobe Acrobat; familiarity with graphics programs is desired (Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop, GIS, Google Earth Pro).

### **Preferred skills**

Preference will be given to people who have received their Ph.D. degrees within the past five years.

### **Term**

This position is for one year, with the possibility of renewal for up to three years. As a Fellow at Dumbarton Oaks, the incumbent will have access to the outstanding resources of the Research Library and become part of the larger community of scholars at Dumbarton Oaks. The expected start date is on or before September 1, 2015. Post-Doctoral Fellows are

expected to live in the Washington, DC area for the duration of their term. Post-Doctoral Fellows are not provided with accommodations.

As you probably know, **PAYSAGE** from so many years, with the events organized and the magazines edited, promotes projects and research about Landscape Architecture. In the context of EXPO 2015, a very important event that will involve not only Milan, but all the world, PAYSAGE organizes, sponsored by the National Council of Architects, Planners, Landscapers and Conservationists and under the patronage of EXPO Milano 2015, the International Symposium **Agritecture & Landscape – Landscape, Agriculture, Architecture, Urban Life: through EXPO 2015**.

**The Symposium promotes** meditations about the relationship between city and country, to collect and compare projects for the correct planning and use of the territory.

**The topic Agritecture & Landscape** aims to reflect proactively about the future of landscape and towns to find new strategies that are able to assign new ethical, economic and social values to the territory, reconnecting nutritional requirements and urban settlement. **The Symposium will discuss the following topics:**

- Landscape upgrading of urban spaces;
- Urban farm;
- Agricultural parks;
- Agricultural upgrading of industrial spaces;
- Innovating projects about tourism and agribusiness.

**It will also set up the International Award Agritecture & Landscape AWARDS**, which, together with the proposed events, will offer an opportunity for deepening the discipline of Landscape Architecture and to spread best practices and knowledge regarding green projects with technological and ecological highly innovative themes at different scales.

**For participants in the event, which responds to the professional development guidelines, it was approved recognition of credits by the National Council of Architects, Planners, Landscapers and Conservationists.**

**We also enclose the project that AGRITECTURE - AGRICULTURE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE URBAN LIFE, THROUGH EXPO 2015 will develop.**

All the organizations, institutions, associations and universities involved with issues for territorial jurisdictions or for scientific contributions were invited to the initiative.

ESEE is a non-profit, member-governed, organisation dedicated to advancing understanding of the relationships among ecological, social and economic systems for the mutual well-being of nature and people.

This conference takes place as this century's key challenges for human society become ever clearer and more entrenched: increasing levels of resource use and environmental impacts; threats to food, water and energy security; unequal distribution of economic and physical wealth; power imbalances and conflicts; new waves of political and economic migration; and the lack of international will to address the reality of planetary threats such as climate change and global biodiversity loss.

ESEE 2015 explores solutions for the transformation to a sustainable society, building on the distinctive contribution of ecological economics, by shining a spotlight on the interdependency of economic activity and natural systems, and identifying options that prioritise human wellbeing within planetary boundaries. The conference will contribute to the dissemination of knowledge on these issues, through oral and poster presentations, keynote lectures from prominent scholars, and lively formal and informal discussions. It also aims to foster future research collaborations between academics and stakeholders, and provide training and learning opportunities for younger researchers through an associated summer school which will feed into the main conference.



This Summer School aims at training students, educators, professionals and landscape scientists, on the methodologies of landscape character assessment (LCA), as a tool for effective protection and management of natural and cultural heritage, with an emphasis on the landscapes of Eastern Mediterranean region.

Building on the research results and educational material, produced by the ENPI MEDSCAPES project (<http://enpi-medscapes.org/index.php/en/>), the purpose of this intensive international Summer School is teaching, training and implementing a common regional approach to landscape assessment methodologies. Specifically, at the end of this course, the students will have mastered:

- a) tools for landscape analysis, evaluation and mapping (LCA),
- b) risk assessment model (RAM) implementation, and
- c) the development of participatory governance and management practices (HIMA and other), for landscape as a public good.

The Summer School will be conducted by an international team of experts and other researchers directly or indirectly involved in the state-of-art production of landscape-related know-how, through the MEDSCAPES project. The School's Steering Committee, with previous experience in carrying out summer schools, was involved in the implementation of LCA methods; has specialized in Lesvos and Eastern Mediterranean landscape typologies; and possesses broad knowledge and experience in the implementation of such methodologies from other E.U. case studies.
