Instructions for a Forum Carpathicum 2016 Abstract

The abstract must be written *in English*. Please follow the format and style described in the template below.

Please indicate the preferred form of the presentation, and, if appropriate, relevance to one of the policy priorities of the Europe 2020 Strategy and the Horizon 2020 Program.

Use A4 (210 mm × 297 mm) paper size with all page margins of 2,5 cm. Extended abstracts for *oral presentation* must be up **4000 characters** including spaces, and poster abstracts up **2000 characters** including spaces (no figures/pictures). ***Please count the characters from the title to the last reference (if any).***

Use font type Times New Roman, with single-spaced lines. Title of the paper (size 12 pts, bold) is followed by one empty line. The presenting author's name should be underlined, surname with Majuscules. Author's affiliations (10 pts, italic, centered) and email address of the author/contact person are written in separate rows.

Abstract text (12 pts) in paragraphs is not indented. References should be indicated in the text in brackets and listed at the end of the abstract (10 pts) (e.g.: Bruckman et al., 2012). Acknowledgement may be addressed as the last paragraph of the main text.

Abstracts must arrive at the Conference Secretariat by **15st April 2016**. The submission of your abstract in Microsoft Word (format: **surname of lead author_FC2016.doc**) is most welcome via email to **fc2016ro@gmail.com** as an attachment.
